In-person Sessions: All of our sessions are fully facilitated and inclusive. Your pupils can meet a 17th-century character and explore the town, train as Civil War soldiers, try to survive a siege, crack codes as spies and explore our breath-taking galleries.

Digital Sessions: Unable to visit the museum? We offer livestreamed sessions to one or more classrooms using your choice of digital platform.

Discovery Boxes: Enhance your classroom teaching with replica objects and accompanying activities.

Remote Resources: Our free-to-access online resource 'Upside-Down World' includes real, accessible 17th-century source material, 3D scanned museum objects and downloadable classroom activities to resource enquiry-based learning in the KS2 classroom before, after or instead of a visit.

KEY STAGE ONE				
Arms & Armour	Help the King defend Newark. Take part in army training in our interactive and object-based session. Dress up as different types of soldiers and handle replica weapons from the battlefield.	●		●
One Man and his Dog	Meet Prince Rupert and his magical pet dog Boye in this puppet-based storytelling session. Learn about Roundheads and Cavaliers and why they were fighting, handle replica objects and find out how Prince Rupert saved the important town of Newark.	●		
KEY STAGE TWO				
Arms & Armour	Train as an infantry soldier and investigate replica armour and weapons used on the Civil War battlefield. Learn about different types of soldiers, find out how they fought and evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of their equipment.	●		●
'Last Town Standing' Town Tour	Meet John or Elizabeth Twentyman. Walk with them to find Newark's surviving Civil War buildings and hear the stories they help to tell. Discover why Newark was such an important town and learn about sieges in this fun participatory tour. An outdoor session that requires appropriate footwear and clothing	●		●
Besieged	Survive a siege in 1646. Bring to life the real townspeople of Newark during its third and final siege. Work in groups to solve the problems faced by the town and learn about civilian life during the conflict.	●	●	●

Civil War Spies	Join a spy ring and become part of the King's intelligence network. Guided by a 17 th -century spy, crack coded messages and decide which East Midlands town should become the King's 'Key to the North'. This hands-on session introduces pupils to Civil War spying techniques and the strategy needed to win a war.	●		●
Mr Clifton's Cupboard	Meet Mr Clifton, Newark's barber surgeon, and find out how wounds were treated in the 17 th century though object handling and film.	●		●

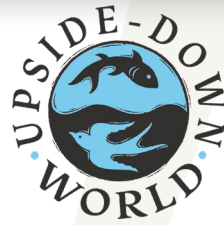

HOW TO BOOK A LEARNING VISIT

1. Identify 3-4 possible dates for your visit.
2. Choose your sessions from the list above.
3. Email civilwarlearning@nsdc.info to enquire about availability. Please include:
 - Your 3-4 preferred visit dates
 - The number and year group of your participants
 - Any additional needs in your group
 - The sessions you would like to include in your programme.
 - Your preferred arrival and departure time
4. Please allow 7 working days for a response. During this time, you may find it useful to check our FAQs and Essential Information online.
5. A confirmation letter will be sent to you once your booking is finalised.
6. You can cancel or amend your visit without penalty up to 14 calendar days before the booked date. We will invoice you after your visit for the number of children booked in our calendar on this date.
7. You and a colleague are most welcome to visit the museum free of charge to familiarise yourself with our site in normal opening hours, without prior booking. Please show a copy of your confirmation letter when you arrive. You can find our opening hours on our web site.

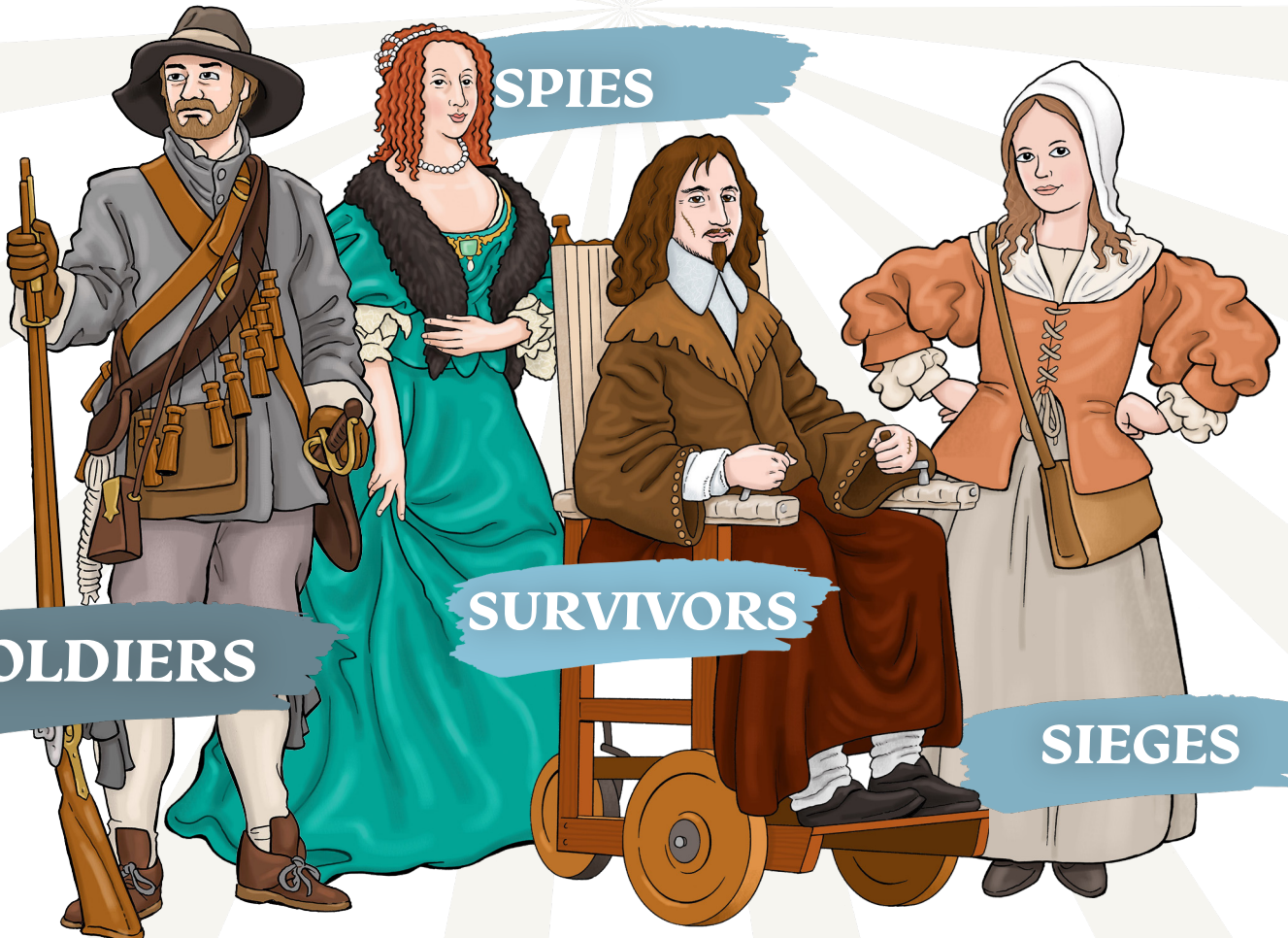
